

GREEN TREE ROAD CONSTRUCTION – STAGE 1 TRAFFIC PROCEDURES

STAGE 1 ROAD CLOSURES – PLEASE CONSULT THE MAP PROVIDED BY WISDOT.

- **Green Tree Road (west of Jean Nicolet Road)** – WisDOT will have this closure in place 24 hours a day.
 - Traffic that normally travels Eastbound on Green Tree Road to Nicolet will need to take an alternate route. WisDOT estimates that less than 15% of the traffic coming to Nicolet uses Eastbound Green Tree Road.
- **Jean Nicolet Road (north of the North Athletic Entrance/Driveway)** – Vehicles will not be able to turn left (Northbound) when leaving Nicolet. WisDOT will have this closure in place 24 hours a day.
 - This closure will have the most significant impact. All traffic leaving Nicolet will be required to turn right resulting in much higher volume on Southbound Jean Nicolet with anticipated delays.
 - The City of Glendale will have traffic control personnel and WisDOT will have a dedicated flagger to direct traffic around Nicolet and ensure cars follow the designated routes.
 - *Increased traffic on Jean Nicolet Road means your morning commute after dropping off students at Nicolet is likely to take longer. It is recommended that you adjust your morning schedule to accommodate the anticipated delays to help you arrive at work and other commitments on time.*
- The City of Glendale will be placing **barricades along the intersections of each street entering the Clovernook Neighborhood at the beginning and end of the school day** (*Daphne Road, Apple Tree Road, Acacia Road, Brentwood Lane & Fairfield Court*).
 - Traffic will be restricted to neighborhood residents only.
 - Because Daphne Road will be closed, student drop-off/pick-up at Door #9 will not be possible.

CHANGES TO DROP-OFF/ARRIVAL PROCEDURES AT THE BEGINNING OF THE SCHOOL DAY

- All Nicolet students that ride the bus to school will be picked up **5 minutes earlier** to ensure an on-time arrival at school.
 - Letters will be sent by Riteway notifying families of the new pick-up time. Again, the earlier pick-up time only applies to high school student bus riders.
 - *Students are encouraged to ride the bus as this will be the easiest way in and out of Nicolet and it will help to reduce overall vehicle traffic.*
- **At approximately 7:10 a.m. all Nicolet parking lot driveways will be closed for approximately 3-5 minutes** and all vehicles will temporarily be held in place.
 - Stopping vehicle traffic will allow all of the school buses to leave at the same time. Riteway anticipates this will allow the buses to pick up middle school and elementary students according to their current schedule.

CHANGES TO SCHOOL PICK-UP/DEPARTURE PROCEDURES AT THE END OF THE DAY

- **All buses will be leaving the Nicolet parking lot at approximately 2:40 p.m.** All vehicles will temporarily be held in place until the buses depart.
 - All of the school buses will leave the parking lot at the same time, just as they did during morning drop-off to ensure on-time pick-up for middle school and elementary students.
 - As soon as the buses have departed Nicolet, all other traffic will be allowed to enter and leave the parking lot.
- **Student cars will be held in the parking lot until approximately 2:40 p.m.** (after all buses have departed). Students will not be able to leave the parking lot before that. Again, all vehicles will be required to turn right coming out of Nicolet onto Jean Nicolet Road.
 - *Students should be aware that increased traffic on Jean Nicolet Road is likely to impact the amount of time it takes to get to after school commitments. Students should plan to notify employers and make arrangements for any other off-campus after school activities.*

SCHOOL START AND END TIMES WILL STAY THE SAME

- At this time we do not anticipate changes to the bell schedule for the remainder of this school year (through June 8, 2018).
- We are waiving the requirement for students to be on campus if they have study halls during 1st or 8th periods.
 - Students may adjust their arrival and departure times accordingly if they have study hall during first or last period only.
 - This change will help to alleviate the number of cars during peak traffic times.
