### **MIAD COURSES:**

#### **The Urban Sketchbook**

The main objective of this course is to study the relationship between walking and making, and how navigating a city can affect how one thinks and therefore how one creates. Through readings, walking tours, and urban games students reimagine their relationship to urban spaces and form a more personal connection to their work. Field trips will take the class to local architecture, neighborhoods, gardens, the abandoned and 'forgotten' places of the city, and shopping districts. The students use their sketchbook as a way to capture observations, illustrate personal narratives, and explore graphic journalism. Along with the sketchbook, students explore basic bookmaking, collage, drawing, and mixed-media processes.

#### **ADVANCED STUDIO PRINTMAKING**

Throughout history, artists have utilized the printing press with various materials as a method for artistic expression. Whether stone, screen, woodblock or metal plate, these materials provide a unique surface for rendering images that extends beyond traditional drawing and painting, with the added ability to be hand-printed as multiples. This course surveys the fine art of printmaking through the lens of contemporary practices, and culminates in a final exhibition. Students develop competency with the materials and tools associated with a variety of printmaking processes, while developing their own personal voice through critique and one-on-one discussion. This in-depth look into the practice of printing is structured to go beyond basic techniques in order to foster an environment for advanced study and personal growth.

#### **Photography: Storytelling Strategies**

Photographers work in a variety of ways to bring storytelling strategies into image making. Instruction includes both traditional and experimental techniques for implementing narrative into singular, as well as sequential, photographic experiences. Further attention is dedicated to how the book form can be utilized in conjunction with photographic imagery and text to relay a story. Prerequisites: Must bring your own DSLR camera, and understand its basic operating functions.
