Here are some important yearbook dates and information for the 2020-2021 school year. This year is a defining moment in your child's life, help them remember all that happened by ordering them a yearbook.



August - January: Yearbooks available for pre-sale (\$70)

Yearbooks can be purchased at the High School Office or on Skyward using the Fee Management Tab - follow [this link](#) for more details. Orders at this price must be made BEFORE January 15th. After January 15th the price will increase to \$80 with a limited amount available for purchase. The only way to ensure a copy is to purchase before January 15th. We will have limited copies available at distribution.

November 20th: Senior portraits and quotes are due

Every senior has the opportunity to send in a portrait for the yearbook. If one is not sent in or given to Mr. Medved by that date, their school ID picture will be used in its place. The due date for portraits has been pushed back to **November 20th**. Detailed requirements can be found below. Portraits should be emailed to yearbook@nicolet.us.

This year we are starting senior quotes. Seniors are only allowed one submission. If quotes are deemed inappropriate they will be discarded and the senior will not get a quote. Quotes are due **November 20th**. The character limit for senior quotes is 140, including spaces.

Senior Portraits Guidelines

Due November 20th

As a senior, students have the opportunity to choose the picture they would like in the yearbook, provided they meet the guidelines below. If photos do not adhere to these guidelines, the ID photo may be used by the yearbook staff.

If you choose to send a hard copy, the requirements are:

5" X 7" or a 4" X 6" – the orientation must be vertical – the picture should be taller than it is wide.

If you choose to send a digital copy, the requirements are:

jpg, tif, or psd format

Resolution: 300 dpi

5" X 7" or a 4" X 6" – the orientation must be vertical – the picture should be taller than it is wide.

Additional specifications:

head and shoulder shot only

vertical layout (no horizontal please)

no props

no hats, including graduation mortar board

Outdoor shots are acceptable

The major studios (Lifetouch, Worzella, and others) will send your student's picture directly to the school. Parents may have their child's picture taken by any studio or individual of their choice, as long as they follow the guidelines above.

Baby Picture Shout-outs

Due November 20th

Senior shout-outs are personalized messages to your senior celebrating their past and future. The character limit is 140. This message will go right below their baby photos.

Shout-outs with digital photos can be submitted and purchased online using [this link](#). You may also drop off a physical photograph with the student's name written on the back, your personalized message (character limit of 140), and the payment to Mr. Medved in room B-135.

All of the proceeds for shout outs go to buy yearbooks for seniors in financial need.
